## The Evergreen Society

The **EVERGREEN SOCIETY** is a giving circle associated with the Second Century Endowment. To become a member, a donor makes a multi-year commitment of at least \$1,000/year for five years or a donation that equals one of the giving levels listed below. By being a part of the Evergreen Society, the donor is giving to the Second Century Endowment. This means that your gift will be kept in perpetuity with only the income being used.

The Giving Levels are:

-  **Diamonds:** \$50,000; \$10,000 for 5 years or in one installment
-  **Emerald:** \$25,000; \$5,000 for 5 years or in one installment
-  **Ruby:** \$10,000; \$2,000 for 5 years or in one installment
-  **Sapphire:** \$5,000; \$1,000 for 5 years or in one installment

Donors will receive a special memento associated with the level of giving. Also, the donor's name will be listed in the Annual Report under the Evergreen Society.
