Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Bald Eagle: United States) – Show the girls a picture of a Bald Eagle and explain that it is the national bird of the United States; explain what “national” means, Adult Guide, page 29

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Lion: Iran) – Show the girls a picture of a Lion and explain that the lion is the symbol of Iran and the national animal of the Netherlands, or Holland, Adult Guide, page 37

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Robin: Great Britain) – Show the girls a picture of a Robin and explain that the Robin is the national bird of the United Kingdom, Adult Guide, page 45

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Cheetah: Kenya) – Show the girls a picture of a Cheetah and explain that the Cheetah is the national animal of Kenya, a country in Africa, Adult Guide, page 51

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Donkey: Mexico) – Show the girls a picture of a Donkey and explain that if we were in Mexico, we might see a donkey, which is called a burro in Spanish, Adult Guide, page 69

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Crane: Japan) – Show the girls a picture of a Crane and an Origami Crane, Adult Guide, page 83

Fruits from Japan – Explain that enjoying seasonal fruits is one-way people in many countries, including Japan, mark the season, Adult Guide, page 85

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Panda: Japan/China) – Show the girls a picture of a Panda and talk about how they are an endangered species, Adult Guide, page 89

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World (Elephant: Kenya, South Africa, Thailand, India) – Show the girls a picture of a Elephant and explain that they are the national animal of Kenya, South Africa, Thailand, and India, Adult Guide, page 97

Opening Ceremony: Animals Around the World – Ask all the girls to join in and imagine how they would feel if they got to see all the animals they've learned about throughout the Journey, Adult Guide, page 105
