

- ◆ **SPLISH, SPLASH, SUMMER SAFETY BASH.** On Saturday, May 9, 2009 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Central Mall in Texarkana, Texas area businesses, volunteer organizations, local school systems will be joining with the Texas Department of Family and Protective Service to present a Kid Fest for all ages. The purpose of the event is to give information on summer activities and programs for children with a focus of keeping kids safe while having a blast. COUNCIL SHOP INFORMATION

PURCHASING EARNED RECOGNITIONS & OFFICIAL PINS:

Leader/assistant should purchase earned badges, patches and recognitions. Parents may purchase ID Strips, troop numbers, insignia tabs, Girl Scout pins, basic books, and uniform components. A signed note from the leader granting permission to pick up earned badges, patches and earned recognitions by someone other than the leader is required.

PAYMENT:

Troop check, personal check, cash, all major credit cards may be used. However at this time certain shops only take certain credit cards for your convenience please check with your local shop. Girls may use their current "**COOKIE CREDITS**". Customer pays all bank charges for returned checks. Mail order purchases **must have payment enclosed or paid prior to ordering.** Customer will be responsible for all shipping charges, which are paid at time of order. Special orders must be paid prior to ordering the items.

SEPARATE CHECKS:

Please use separate checks for store orders, program fees, and registration. These are handled in different departments.

EXCHANGES ONLY-NO REFUNDS:

Diamonds Council Policy is to exchange all current merchandise for customers who may have bought the wrong size, style, age level or basic insignia.

Any current official insignia, badge or patch may be credited against your present order. Your receipt should accompany size or item exchanges for full price. All discontinued or dated items sold are final. We do not hold credit memos for individuals. We cannot exchange items purchased from outside our council. If you are unsure if an item is returnable please review the following rules for returns. *Diamonds council reserves the right to refuse the return of used, damaged and/or discontinued merchandise.*

MERCHANDISE EXCHANGES OTHER THAN OFFICIAL INSIGNIA

- 1.) No exchanges without a receipt.
- 2.) No exchanges after 10 days from date of purchase.
- 3.) Merchandise must still have tags and in original packaging.
- 4.) No exchanges on dated or discontinued items.
- 5.) Special order exchanges will be charged a restocking fee and depending on the item may not be able to be exchanged at all.

LEADERS WITH TROOP ACCOUNTS

Troop Leaders have 30 days to return current official insignia
(Pins, Try-Its, Badges, Patches, Identification sets and numbers)

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCE REFUND:

Diamonds Council has an exchange only policy. Special circumstance refunds will require approval from the Director of Merchandising. **Refunds that are approved and under \$20 cash will be given all refunds approved over \$20 a check request will be required. Approved refunds have the same requirements as our exchange policy, please view above.**

ORDERS/ORDERING:

Shops will place weekly orders on Monday providing orders total \$100 or more. Mail and phone orders are processed within 48 hours from stock on hand. Ordering at least three weeks prior to your awards event allows us time to receive items that might not be in stock or to order quantities of special items.

PLEASE PLAN AHEAD SO WE MAY MEET YOUR NEEDS!

- ◆ Place orders 3 to 4 weeks before your awards ceremony.
- ◆ Mail, e-mail, or fax your order to us to be held for pick up; quantities may be adjusted at this time. Please keep in mind items will be held for only 5 business days then put back in stock.
- ◆ We are happy to mail/UPS orders to you; appropriate handling charges will be added.
- ◆ It is best to pre-order gift needs or select uniform items in advance of date needed to insure availability.
- ◆ Anticipate seasonal needs (Troop start-up, Investiture Ceremony, Holiday gifts, Thinking Day, End-of-year awards/gifts).

TOP 5 QUESTIONS LEADERS ASK

WHERE CAN I PURCHASE GIRL SCOUT MERCHANDISE?

Girl Scout merchandise can be purchased at the council store or at a local designated store. For shopping ease, you can shop by mail, phone, email, or internet (give address, phone numbers and other information).

WHAT IS AN INVESTITURE?

An investiture is the ceremony where girls and adults are invested into a troop. The reciting of the Girl Scout Promise and the Girl Scout Law is part of this ceremony. The girls are then given their membership pins and officially invested into Girl Scouts. Ceremony ideas can be found in the "Girl Scout Ceremonies" Handbook and the "Leader's Guide".

WHAT IS INSIGNIA?

Official insignia are items that only registered Girl Scouts can wear. The insignia includes the membership pins, tabs, troop numbers, and all earned items. Insignia can be found in the Girl Scout Catalog on the last pages and are listed by age level.

CAN PARENTS SHOP?

Parents are always welcome in the Girl Scout store. The store is a regular store that is open to all customers. Some items are official and require authorization. As a troop, you and the parents will decide who will purchase the official items for the girls.

WHAT DO I NEED TO PURCHASE?

This is a question that is often asked of store personnel. We know the basic items that leaders and parents need for new girls. What we may not know, is what the troop as a whole has decided to purchase and who will make the purchase. Sometimes the leader will purchase all the official items for the troop, other times the parents will be requested to purchase these items for the investiture. Either way is fine as long as a decision has been made and agreed upon. Use our "SHOPPING GUIDE" to list for parents the essential merchandise to purchase.

CHOOSING A TROOP CREST

In the early days of Girl Scouting, troop crests were used to identify a troop. The rapid growth of the movement soon made numbering necessary, but crests were kept as a symbol of the troop's goal or main interest. Today, troops should think carefully about the crest they choose. It should have a special meaning to them, one they can pass along to new members each year. The symbol can be used on a troop flag or to mark troop equipment. Every member should know what their crest is and what it means.

Crests are used by Junior, Cadette, Senior and Ambassador level troops.

A new crest is not chosen every year. Once chosen, a crest is used for the life of a troop. If a girl enters an established troop then she takes the crest of that troop. If an entire troop bridges to the next level and forms a new troop they may either keep the crest from the previous level or select a new one. If part of a troop bridges and forms a new troop they too have the same option. The girls remaining behind should keep the old crest unless the focus of the troop has drastically changed from the time the original crest was selected.

There are 24 crests including the blank where troops may design their own symbol. Following is the meaning of the other 23.

MEANING OF TROOP CRESTS

BLUEBIRD- traditional symbol of happiness and cheerfulness.

CARDINAL- known for its song, Good Cheer and bright color; at home in the city or in the wild.

CLOVER LEAF- traditional symbol of good luck; also the shape of the Girl Scout Trefoil.

DAFFODIL- spring flower, symbol of sunny personality.

DOGWOOD- new life, rebirth; a spring flowering tree.

FALLING STAR- symbol of good luck- makes wishes come true.

FORGET-ME-NOT- long standing symbol of friendship and loyalty.

HAWAIIAN LEI- symbol for circle of friendship.

LIGHTNING- symbol of power in nature.

LILY OF THE VALLEY- symbol of purity, in folklore, it is known as Fairy Bells.

MORNING GLORY- symbol of awaking of new day and glory to God.

MUSICAL NOTES- international symbol of music and song.

PINE TREE- symbol for boldness, loyalty and stability.

PURPLE PANSY- also known as "hearts-ease" stands for service and friendship.

PURPLE VIOLET- symbolic today of a clean environment and a clean earth.

RED ROSE- the "All American" flower, symbol of beauty and love.

SAILBOAT- symbolizes freedom on the wind of an adventurous journey.

SEASHELL- a promise of discovery – a gift from the sea.

STAR OF BETHLEHEM- a guide or beacon that shows the way, a goal.

UNICORN- symbol of magic, mystery, and purity.

WATERFALL- symbol of the Royal House of Stuart – it stands for loyalty and challenge (It was also the crest of the first troop in Savannah, GA.).

WHITE ROSE- symbol of faith and loyalty, and the quest for truth.

WILD ROSE- perseverance and adaptability even in the face of adversity, beauty in strength, and exploring possibilities.
