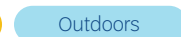

Event Registration and Information

How to Register for a Program Online

Registering online is the fastest way to reserve your spot. Here are some tips to help you get started!

- ▶ In the **My Events** tab of your MyGS account, you can view your current and past program registrations and check for any outstanding program registration fees.
- ▶ Troop co-leaders can register family and troop members for programs.
- ▶ You may choose to pay with program credit (Diamond Dollars), though more action is still required:
 - ▶ **NOTE:** Your spot is not reserved until the full program fee or required deposit is paid.
 - ▶ To pay with Diamond Dollars, call the retail shop at 800-632-6894.
 - ▶ Some programs require additional documents or information. Check the program's **Additional Documents** section in the My Events tab to see if this applies.

EVENT ETIQUETTE

All adults and girls are expected to follow all components of the Girl Scout Law and the Safety Activity Checkpoints to help ensure the safety of Girl Scouts, families, leaders, and staff. Please have directions to the event venue and allow enough time to arrive, park, and walk to check-in before the event begins. Check the weather and dress appropriately for the event. Let girls take the lead! Adults should supervise from nearby while allowing girls to participate with minimal intervention. Event leaders may occasionally need extra help, so if you have additional adults or self-sufficient girls, consider asking how you can assist. Be sure to thank your event leaders for sharing their time and skills!

Remember: Girl Scouts leave no trace!

ACCOMMODATIONS

Please list all accommodations needed (allergies, accessibility needs, etc.) on the online event registration form.

EVENT CANCELLATIONS

If an event is canceled, the troop or parent contact listed on the registration will be notified by phone or email. For troop registrations, the troop contact is responsible for notifying all registered girls. Cancellations by the council or program partner will receive a full refund.

FEES

Event fees cover administrative costs, badges/patches, and other program expenses. Fees can be paid with troop funds, individually, or with Diamond Dollars. Scholarships are not available.

EVENT REFUND/SUBSTITUTIONS

Event fee refunds will be given if the registrar is notified in writing 10 business days PRIOR to the event. No-shows are refunded only for serious illness (with a doctor's note submitted within 7 days) or a family death. Events costing \$5 or less are ineligible for a refund. Substitutions are welcome, but please notify staff during check-in if you are substituting one Girl Scout for another.

EVENT MINIMUMS

Each event requires a minimum number of participants, listed in the event description. If the minimum is not met, the event will be canceled and refunds issued.

REGISTRATION

All families have a MyGS account (use "Forgot Password" if needed). Registration is first come, first served, and payment is required to reserve a spot.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES

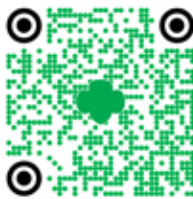

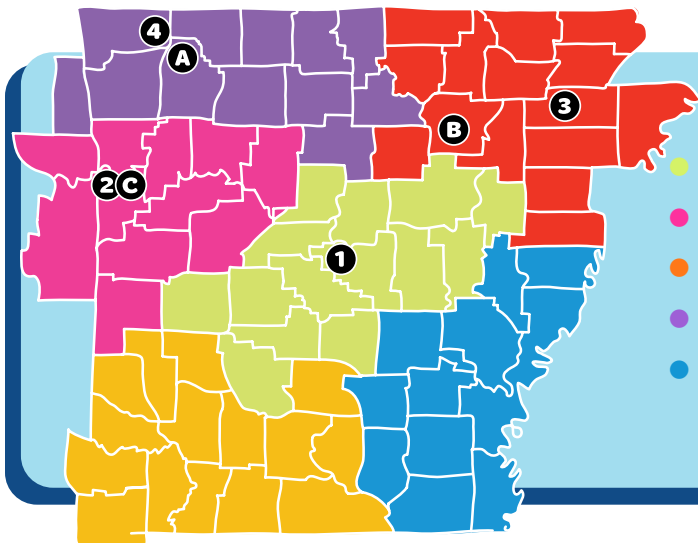

This 13.5-acre campus offers flexible meeting spaces, overnight options, and progressive outdoor camping with STEAM and woodworking programming woven throughout. Whether you're here to relax by the creek, try something new, or gather your group, Burnham Woods is ready to welcome you!



Discovery Arts Studio

The former Girl Scout regional office was transformed into a new arts education center and multipurpose meeting space. This space features designated areas for arts and crafts instruction, troop gatherings, program delivery and storage. The design includes a scenic overlook that connects indoor programming with the surrounding natural environment, creating opportunities to incorporate nature into the creative process.



Inspiration Hub at Kelley Cabin

Program Aide Training

Program Aide training helps Cadette Girl Scouts deepen their understanding of leadership while learning how to effectively work with younger Girl Scouts. This training is a prerequisite for any Girl Scout wishing to earn her Program Aide Pin. Program Aides can apply their skills by supporting younger Girl Scouts at council programs, camps, and troop or service unit events.

Volunteer in Training

The Volunteer in Training (VIT) program is for Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts who want to mentor Daisy, Brownie, Junior, or Cadette groups outside of camp. This fully virtual training is one requirement for earning the VIT pin. After completing the training, Girl Scouts partner with an adult mentor and create and implement badge program over four or more sessions.

Highest Awards Training

In-person Silver and Gold Award training is available upon request with advance notice. These sessions provide Girl Scouts and volunteers with hands-on guidance and support, opportunities to ask questions, and a better understanding of the awards process, expectations, and requirements.

Bronze. Silver. Gold. These are the highest honors a Girl Scout can earn. Through them, girls impact their communities, challenge themselves, and gain an edge after high school.



Girl Scout Bronze Award

GIRL SCOUT JUNIORS | GRADES 4-5

The Bronze Award is the highest award a Girl Scout Junior can achieve. Girls work together as a group to complete a Take Action project that directly benefits the Girl Scout community or their local community or neighborhood.



Girl Scout Silver Award

GIRL SCOUT CADETTEs | GRADES 6-8

The Girl Scout Silver Award is the highest award a Girl Scout Cadette can achieve and gives girls a chance to work with a small team or as an individual. Girls focus on projects that make lasting change in their communities.



Girl Scout Gold Award

GIRL SCOUT SENIORS AND AMBASSADORS | GRADES 9-12

The Girl Scout Gold Award represents the highest achievement in Girl Scouting. Open to Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors, this prestigious award challenges them to change the world by solving a community problem in an innovative and sustainable way.

The Gold Award is highly regarded by admissions counselors; recipients are eligible for additional scholarships and may qualify to advance one rank in the military.

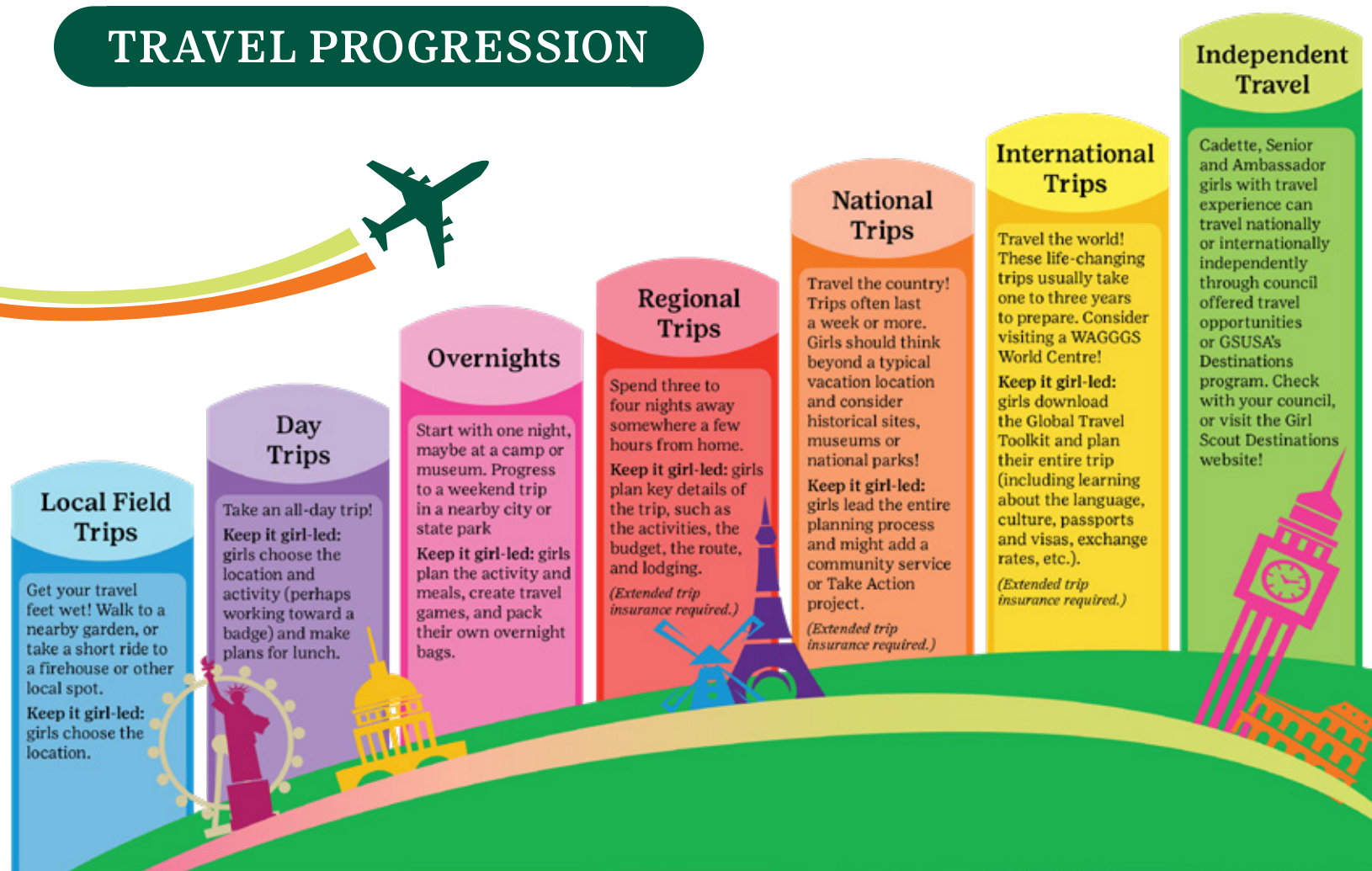
